




KENT FALTING LTFCA PRESIDENT / PARKWAY H.S.

Can you feel the excitement in the air! Outdoor track is finally here. I'm going to admit one of my track coaching superstitions to you. Before every single meet, I have to listen to the song. "Starting Over" by Chris Stapleton. It's not my favorite song but it reminds me that every track meet and every season is a chance to start over. My relay team dropped the baton last week, this week we're starting fresh. My two-miler won the last meet, it doesn't mean he's going to win this week. We're starting over. A kid ran terribly last season, who cares? This season, he gets to start over.

Two years ago, Will Achee quit playing football for Parkway High School, and we didn't see him until track season. An athlete with amazing potential took 6 months off from sports, got a job, and showed up out of shape. After making the state meet as a freshman and a sophomore, Will sat at home for the 2023 State Championships. Last year, Will changed his entire way of training and committed to being the best version of himself. He started over with a new outlook. He worked on endurance with the cross country team, he trained in the winter, he pushed through a small plateau in the early parts of outdoor season and went on to make the state meet in three events. He broke the Parkway school records in the 200, 400, and 4x400 (a record that stood for 40 years)! He finished 2nd at state in the 400m with a time of 47.19. Will was a late signee with Northwestern State University where on Monday, he placed 2nd in the Southland Conference in the 400m and anchored his 4x400 team to a win! 22 months after missing out on a state meet, Will has performed at the highest level both in high school and college. All because he was willing to start over!

As you go through the first parts of this outdoor season, be willing to hit the reset button after a bad meet. Give a new kid an opportunity in a different event. Give a second chance to that kid who would take advantage of it. Week after week, start fresh, and like Will, give yourself a chance for you and your team to find a spot on that podium!

This definitely is a testament to his dedication, winning the state championship as both a freshman and sophomore, not winning it as a junior, and coming back to put his stamp on the event as a senior. 



ABITA SPRINGS, La. (WVUE) - Reidenauer, 18, grew up in Abita Springs and was known for her determination, athleticism, and positive spirit. She was a standout in both track and swimming at Fontainebleau High, serving as captain for both programs before joining LSU's track and field team as a pole vaulter.

"She always had a smile on her face, she was so positive all the time," said her friend and former swim teammate Sydney Wycoff. "She had a big impact on so many people."

Mitch Rabalais, a lifelong friend and neighbor, described Reidenauer as a well-known and beloved member of the small Abita Springs community.

"We are devastated by the tragic passing of Dillon Reidenauer, who was taken from us much too soon," LSU track and field coach Dennis Shaver said. "Everyone in our LSU Track & Field family is keeping Dillon's loved ones in our thoughts and prayers, as well as those of the other individual lost in the incident.
